

Aggarwal, Ajay London School of Hygiene & Tropical Medicine



Dr Ajay Aggarwal is a Clinical Oncologist and Senior Visiting Research Fellow at The Institute of Cancer Policy, Kings College London. His main research interests centre upon the development of strategies for the delivery of affordable and equitable cancer care in developed and emerging economies. He is currently based at the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine in the Department of Health Services Research and Policy where he is investigating the impact of patient choice, hospital competition and service centralisation policies on NHS cancer services, specifically their effect on patient mobility, technology diffusion and system reconfiguration. Since 2013, he has been the oncology coordinator for the National Prostate Cancer Audit based at The Royal College of Surgeons of England, which aims to assess the processes and outcomes of care for newly diagnosed prostate cancer patients in the NHS. As part of this work, he has developed validated outcome indicators using administrative datasets to assess the quality of radiotherapy and surgical treatment at the individual patient and hospital level. He graduated from Guy's, Kings' & St Thomas' Medical school having attained a BSc in Management at Imperial College London. He has an MSc in the Science of Cancer from The Institute of Cancer Research and an MSc in Health, Population and Society from The London School of Economics. He has previously worked at the World Health Organisation in Geneva, and in Fortaleza, Brazil.
