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Professor Mark Bellis is Director of the Public Health Institute and Professor of Public Health and Behavioural Sciences at Liverpool John Moores University. He has established and led two World Health Organization (WHO) Collaborating Centres - one focused on Violence Prevention and the other on Investment for Health and Well-being. For over a decade, he has served as the United Kingdom's Focal Point to the WHO on violence and injury prevention. Professor Bellis leads national and international research programmes spanning Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs), life course health, violence prevention, health economics, the commercial determinants of health, and public health history.

His work includes original research, systematic reviews, and the translation of evidence into policy and practice. A registered Consultant in Public Health within the National Health Service (NHS), he was awarded an OBE in 2009 for services to healthcare. Professor Bellis has authored over 250 peer-reviewed academic papers, along with more than 300 reports and books. He remains actively engaged in applied, cross-sector initiatives addressing both current and emerging public health challenges.
