She has extensive experience in Public Health projects aimed at understanding and responding to health needs, as well as the design, implementation and evaluation of health-promoting interventions and policies, using participatory research and a combination of quantitative and qualitative methods. She seeks to produce evidence for innovative policies and action strategies on complex public health issues that improve the health of populations.

She acts as an expert in international organizations such as ECDC, WHO and IOM. She is a member of numerous scientific networks in the field of Public Health and is a member of the EUPHA Steering Committee 'Section on Migrant Health'. She was a member of FCT's Scientific Council for Life and Health Sciences.

She was director of the International Public Health Unit at IHMT, coordinated the PhD in International Health and the thematic line 'Health Challenges for Travellers and Migrants' at the 'Global Health and Tropical Medicine' centre at IHMT NOVA.
