

Fjeldsted, Katrín

Standing Committee of European Doctors



Dr Katrín Fjeldsted is a medical doctor and a former member of the national parliament of Iceland. She completed her general practice training in 1979 in the United Kingdom after receiving her Medical Degree from the University of Iceland in 1973. She worked as a family doctor at Efstaleiti Health Clinic in Reykjavík for 36 years. From 1999-2003, Dr Fjeldsted was a member of the parliament and a deputy member from 1995-1999 and 2003-2007. This allowed her to be a member of the Icelandic parliamentary delegation to the United Nations General Assemblies in 1999 and 2000, and a representative of Iceland at the UN conference on sustainable development in Johannesburg in 2002. Moreover, Dr Fjeldsted was a member of the Reykjavík city council in 1982-1994. Dr Fjeldsted has also chaired the Icelandic College of Family Physicians and been a board member of the Icelandic Medical Association. Her involvement at the Standing Committee of European Doctors (CPME) began in 2000, and she served as CPME President from 2013 to 2015.
