Corinne is a sociologist with experience in low income countries like Niger, Ecuador, and Bangladesh, where she focused on public health programmes including safe waste disposal, nutrition, and water/sanitation. After returning to the Netherlands, she earned a Master's in Public Health. She worked on infectious disease control, nutrition, NCD prevention (especially cardiovascular disease and cancer). Since 2014, she has been a Global Health Advocate at Wemos, a rights based health development NGO in Amsterdam. She specializes in Human Resources for Health, emphasizing health worker migration, access inequalities, and mobility in Europe. Corinne co-authored a chapter on health worker migration in the context of free movement, in a forthcoming book on the merits of a true European Health Union, by the Foundation for European Progressive Studies.
