Kiti Kajana Phillips is a program officer for the Access to Medicines and Innovation Initiative of the Open Society Foundations Public Health Program. Kiti previously served as a program manager for the American Cancer Society, and oversaw a capacity building program that trained more than 900 scholars in over 88 countries. In the lead-up to the UN High-Level Meeting on Non-Communicable Diseases, she served as a bridge between civil society organizations and UN Missions and agencies.
