Alison Maassen is a Programme Manager at EuroHealthNet. She is responsible for supporting the Director in overseeing the development and implementation of EuroHealthNet's programming and leads EuroHealthNet's work in the area of vaccination. Alison coordinated the IMMUNION ("Improving IMMunisation cooperation in the European UNION") project, funded by the European Union's 3rd Health Programme, and leads Dissemination and Communication activities for the RIVER-EU ("Reducing Inequalities in Vaccine uptake in the European Region – Engaging Underserved communities") project, funded by the Horizon 2020 research programme.

Alison has significant experience in project and association management, as well as experience in designing and implementing health promotion interventions at the community level. Prior to joining EuroHealthNet, she worked extensively in the field of immunisation, serving as Programme Manager for the Network for Education and Support in Immunisation at the University of Antwerp, and as a founding member of the Secretariat for the International Association of Immunization Managers (now the Boost Community) at the Sabin Vaccine Institute in Washington DC.

Alison holds an MSc in Public Health (Health Promotion) from the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine, as well as a BA in International Affairs and Anthropology from The George Washington University in Washington DC. She has worked at global and (sub)national levels with policy makers, health professionals, community leaders, researchers, and other stakeholders from regions as diverse as Latin America, the Middle East and North Africa, and Southeast Asia.
