Ulf Kallweit, MD, is Professor of Neurology and holds the Professorship for Narcolepsy and Hypersomnolence Research at Witten/Herdecke University, Germany. In addition, he is a Consulting Research Professor at Stanford University. He established and leads the European Academy of Neurology (EAN) Task Force on Environmental Influences in Neurology.

His main scientific interests focus on environmental neurology, specifically how environmental factors and changing conditions affect brain function, neurological health, and sleep-wake regulation. This research also encompasses the translational and clinical aspects of narcolepsy and hypersomnolence disorders, as well as sleep and wake disturbances in neurological diseases. He has authored more than 100 scientific publications, including articles published in *Nature*, and has received several prestigious research awards, including the 1st Prize in Research in Neurodegenerative Diseases from the Franco Regli Foundation and the Pfizer Research Prize in Neurosciences and Diseases of the Nervous System. He serves as Editor for various neurology journals and is a member of several national and international scientific societies.

Within the EAN, he has held several leadership and advisory positions. He served as Chair of the EAN Programme Committee and previously co-chaired the Scientific Panel on Sleep-Wake Disorders. He currently acts as an Observer to the EAN Board and co-chairs the European project "The Burden of Sleep/Wake Disorders." He is a Fellow of the EAN.
